This year as part of UTS Sydney 2005 Autumn Graduation Ceremonies we celebrated the first graduates of the UTS/Trisakti MBA. This was a very special event for the Graduate School of Business and one of its offshore partners Trisakti University. We were fortunate to have representatives from Trisakti University participate in the Graduation ceremony in Sydney. These celebrations of academic achievement hold great significance to the students, their family and friends as they received their awards from the Chancellor Prof. Vicki Sara.

The next intake of students will be in August 2005 and we wish them every success in their futures.

## Boston Consulting Group 2005 Competition

This year was the first occasion since 2001 that UTS entered a team in the post graduate division of the competition. The last occasion we won the regionals was in 1999, and were runners-up in the Nationals in 2000. This year, following great interest and enthusiasm on behalf of students, we resurrected the Graduate School of Business's team. Our team did extremely well coming in as third runner-up in a field of eight NSW universities. The order was AGSM, MGSM, Newcastle, UTS, followed by UNSW, Sydney Uni, Wollongong, and ANU. The first two teams go through to the Nationals.

After six years, Associate Professor Graeme Sheather passed the baton to David Bedford to coach the undergraduates and this year coached the post graduate team of Ravi Bordia, Baba Hazuria, Keith Paul, Timo Weis and Kun Yang. These students have put other MBAs 'on notice' after four years, and deserve our heartiest congratulations for their efforts and dedication to reviving UTS's business competition reputation. Those team members to return in 2006 vow to put UTS back in the winning circle.

The UTS undergraduate team won the NSW Regionals, coming first out of five Universities ahead of UNSW, Sydney Uni, ANU and Macquarie. The first two teams go through to the National competition.

### Mathematics and ICT Study Centre

For research postgraduate students we coordinate workshops through the GSB focusing on reading statistical articles, interview techniques, designing questionnaires and using software for research (NVivo, SPSS and Minitab). We are also able to provide some one-to-one assistance with statistical design and analysis. It is always better to see a statistician before you collect the data rather than try to sort it out at the analysis stage. For international students, we run orientation programs that include basic computing skills (Word, Excel and PowerPoint) and Statistics and Research Methods (including SPSS).
